The Presidents and the Vice Presidents of the Clubs under the guidance of the members of the Students Council organize a number of interactive activities for all the club members.

Academic Clubs

For Classes IX-XII

- **Finsight**

(Business, Finance and Economics)

Objectives:

- To give simplified information of Business economics and finance management to the enrolees
- Give application-based solutions and concepts, rather than theoretical subject matter with little practical basis
- Introduce Science and humanities students to the field, enabling them to participate in more commerce events

Suggested Activities:

- Simulate real life topic related cases to give first hand practical knowledge of problem solving and critical thinking
- Have group discussions and brainstorming sessions

- **Political Science, Philosophy, History Club**

Objectives:

- The club aims to facilitate in-depth discussions and help enhance one's knowledge in the fields of political science, history and philosophy.
- Students would share their opinions in a safe space, where they can be heard and contested by other people.
- Students' knowledge about various theories, historical events, political processes will expand outside the scope of classroom learning.



Suggested Activities:

- preparing for and taking part in quizzes
- writing research papers and articles
- coming up with solutions in the form of policies
- Policy-analysis
- Discussing theories and lives of philosophers

- **Anveshika**

(Science, Engineering, Mathematics)

Objectives:

- Allow students to explore the fields of science and mathematics backed by adequate technological support
- In-depth study of various concepts through experimentation under expert guidance
- Prepare students for quizzes, Olympiads and mental math exercises.
- Open ended experimentation in science
- engaging in practical learning of science
- discussion of scientific research, principles and phenomenon
- understanding applications of scientific concepts

Suggested Activities:

- documentation of findings
- possible presentation of learning's
- Build models with the help of YouTube, mentors and peer-learning

- **Technology And Computer Sciences Club**

Objectives:

- Introduce students to the fields of coding, programming ,etc.
- learn website development and other relevant skills via peer learning
- work through programming guides
- collaborate on projects

Suggested Activities:

- Intra school programs like hackathons, etc to prepare students for future events
- discuss research and developments related to technology
- conduct workshops related to computer science
- discuss and debate the ethics and implications of certain technologies
- Learn new skills by external mentors or from platforms like YouTube, khan academy etc.



- **The Shishukunj Literary Society**

Objectives:

- Provide a space for literature enthusiasts to discuss books, movies, poetry, songs ,etc via book exchanges, fandom discussions and more
- Engage in unrestricted learning outside the classrooms through guest appearances by authors and alumni (for example- a special session to educate budding bloggers)
- Facilitate creative writing by students in the form of short stories, songs, various forms of poetry etc.

Suggested Activities:

- Host a poetry festival and/or book fairs
- Games like guess the poet, literary bluff, the paperback game, “be a fictional character for a day” etc.
- Introduce a competition called ‘Prose for Change’ where contestants would be required to write for spreading awareness about a social cause. Winners’ entries will be given wide coverage.
- A magazine to be created at the end of the session to showcase the creative work of all club members

Cultural Clubs

For Classes VI-XII

- **Abhinay**
The Drama Club

Objectives:

- The club aims to be a platform where students interested in acting, direction, screenplay, etc are able to showcase and enhance their skills by participating in various activities, workshops and peer learning.
- Students will gain proficiency in various styles
- Acquire the skill set to use visual, auditory skills in support of oral communication, physical gestures and facial expressions.
- Students will learn to deliver appropriate theatrical expressions and presentations to an audience

Suggested Activities:

- Prepare short skits/nukkad natak to be performed before the school
- At the end of the year, the Drama and Film/Photography clubs can come together and create a documentary to showcase what they’ve learnt throughout the year.



- **The Film And Photography Club**

Objectives:

- Understanding film movements and their important filmmakers
- Learning about tone and emotion both in film and photography
- Introduction to cinematic language and techniques
- Help students understand and hone their own aesthetic, both in film and photography
- Gaining practical knowledge about software's and unique ways to use them

Suggested Activities:

- quizzes about films,
- DIY filmmaking/photography challenges
- At the end of the year, the Drama and Film/Photography clubs can come together and create a documentary to showcase what they've learnt throughout the year.

- **The Music Club**

Objectives:

- To provide the musicians in school a place to enhance and showcase their talents.
- Original music creation would be one of the main objectives of this club.
- Allow enthusiasts to discuss song writing and composing

Suggested Activities:

- For students who wish to understand the history and influence of music in addition to playing instruments, such group discussions may be arranged.
- Formation of bands , medleys , etc.
- Organise inter and intra school competitions for the same

- **Kalakriti**

The Art and Design Club

Objectives:

- discuss artists and popular paintings
- interpreting art
- recreating art
- sharing art and inspiration
- sharing/teaching different types of fine arts (painting, doodling, sketching) + techniques
- Studying different art movements
- Introduction to visual thinking and visual language



- Enhance the concept of aesthetics and study different design styles

Suggested Activities:

- Members could organise an art exhibition
- Could organise competitions like “best out of waste”

- **The Public Speaking Club**

Objectives:

- Provide a platform to students for honing their public speaking skills through non-competitive activities
- Allow students to practice for MUNs, inter-school activities and discussions and enhance their overall personalities

Suggested Activities:

- Forms of public speaking like parliamentary and turn-coat debates, panel discussions, declamations, elocutions, extempore, etc. may be practiced
- Intra-class events can be held by the club to promote public speaking
- Open-mic event may be hosted by the club
